Support Local Residents and urge:-

- 1). RBWM to publish Flood Investigation Reports
- 2). RBWM to publish results of Stage 2 of Water Catchment Study
- 3). RBWM Planning and Drainage Departments to reject the Phoenix Gym's Application to Discharge huge volumes of Surface Water into the Fifield Road Ditch. This Ditch is critical and putting additional volumes of Water into it will exacerbate Flooding
- * Upstream and to the South in Fifield Village
- * Downstream and to the North on Fifield Road
- 4). RBWM and Phoenix Gym to work together and pursue the much more suitable and cost effective Site at Braywick Park. (Previous letter to Phoenix Gym dated April 16, 2016)
